Active Items

- 1. Quarterly(ish) symposium on environmental topics.
 - a. Dark Sky Initiative, CEC's Community Summit Series, June 23rd 7:15pm, telescope viewing at 8:45pm
 - i. RSVP required for presentation, limited to ~30ppl, no RSVP required for telescope viewing
 - ii. Set up table with handouts (recycling guidelines, plants, grass cycling, etc...)
 - iii. Kathryn Ask library about book display relating to dark sky topic and any possibility for another venue if demand is high
 - iv. Josh Buy speaker gifts 2 gift cards \$50/ea to Raven & Lilly (restaurant on Square)
 - v. Advertising mainly through library, get info to Jennifer Casey
 - b. Invasive Plants / Native plants Aug/Sep

- 3. Milk carton campaign
 - a. Any other regional recycling facilities that take coated board / milk cartons?
 - b. Josh emailed Republic and has not heard back from them but will check again
- 4. Glass recycling
 - a. Mary mentioned a group in New Orleans that has a glass crusher and uses the sand she will reach out to them.
 - b. Bryan brought up the option to have a glass collection area in the city, we could give the glass to a construction company who has a glass crusher, who can then sell the sand.

- 5. Student application
 - a. Josh investigate this application process. In the past this has been done in the Spring.
- 6. Recycling social media campaign idea:
 - a. Each month we can highlight the different places that recycle items that are not collected curbside: i.e. household batteries, car batteries, glass, hazardous waste like a "Did you Know" segment. That way people know it cannot go in the curbside collection cart but can be taken somewhere other than the landfill.
 - b. Paul will check with Jennifer Casey and the E-cycler for a follow-up article about Recycle Saturday
- 7. Recycling Education cart stickers and magnets (ongoing)
 - a. Bryan mentioned elementary schools are the best place to target as far as making an impact
 - b. Sanitation is closed on Fridays, this would be the best day to visit each school, have an assembly, bring the truck, have games, go over recycle guidelines, etc...
 - c. Six total elementary schools, you could do two schools in a day
 - d. Could create a contest amongst classes with pledges signed by parents (sheet has recycle guidelines on it) saying that they will recycle
 - e. Aim for Oct/November
 - f. Gather ideas as to what the day would be like, etc...
