- 1. Recycling Education
  - a. Leanne Rainey to attend a future meeting to discuss recycling education?

  - e. So far, only 3-4 people on waitlist, but if we advertise earlier and get 15+ people on waitlist we could move over to city hall.
- 3. Paper bags vs plastic for curbside lawn waste
  - a. Goal: To divert plastic bags of leaves and other yard waste going to the landfill. How do we work towards this?
    - i. Paul, Josh, Billy sit down to determine what could work and how the process would run

- ii. Petition Mayor and Board with plan and/or invite Alderman Marshall to a meeting to gain support
- 4. Dark Sky / Streetlights
  - a. Paul spoke with town engineer; PATH is the streetlight consulting company that counted/mapped them (~7900 total). Town's goal is to buy back the streetlights from MLGW, however not agreed upon between MLGW and city yet. LED upgrades are in the discussion. We should get locations of test sites in the next few weeks.
  - b. Kathryn contact Charity for her PowerPoint presentation and more information on dark sky initiatives and possibly get her help in writing a letter and creating a presentation for the Mayor and Board.
  - c. Plan to get on Mayor and Board schedule in Jan/Feb to present our information.
- 5. Milk carton campaign
  - a. Kathryn emailed family and they were thankful we were still researching and trying to find solutions.
  - b. TerraCycle Cost prohibitive and therefore not a viable option.
- 6. Social media campaign idea:
  - a. Publish the town's tonnage numbers regarding waste, recycling, tree trimmings and brush, etc... with some goals for improvement each quarter (smaller percentage of overall waste going to landfill)
  - b. Paul ask Jennifer Casey to post the loose-leaf collection video and information
  - c. Mickey write post for Dec (eco friendly gift wrapping) and send to Paul to send to Jennifer
  - d. Other ideas to add to social media calendar:
    - i. Life cycle of a leaf or plastic bag
    - ii. "If you see something, say something" call the police non-emergency line if you see trucks not covered and garbage flying out of the truck

  - a. New town horticulturist / Arboretum certification / sign replacement update
  - b. Educational / Awareness campaign (website, communications, interactive maps, etc)
- 8. Fair on the Square 2023
  - a. If we determine how paper bags for lawn waste will work before May, we could have branded paper bags available to hand out and advertise paper vs plastic usage.
  - b. Handouts: life cycle of plastic bag, or life cycle of a leaf bagged in plastic vs picked up for compost.
