

Town of Collierville

A regular meeting of the Collierville Heritage Commission was held on July 12, 2023 at 4:00pm at the Morton Museum of Collierville History, located at 196 N. Main Street, Collierville, Tennessee.

The following members of the Heritage Commission were present: Annette Key, John Moore, Betty Edmunds, Skeeter Rutledge, Taylor Stamps, Ginny Nanney, and Mayor Stan Joyner. Staff member present was Museum Director, Kate Renner. Ms. Edmunds called the meeting to order at 4:00pm.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM MAY 10, 2023

Ms. Edmunds asked if there were any corrections or additions to the May 10, 2023 meeting minutes. A commission member requested the following phrase be added to the items of acquisition discussion regarding to the Kerley donation, "...motion to accept the Kerley donation items was made and failed due to lack of second". Ms. Key called for approval of the May 10 Heritage Commission with inclusion of the suggested amendment. Ms. Edmunds seconded. All were in favor, none were opposed. Motion was approved.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

The only item of unfinished following the May 10, 2023 Heritage Commission meeting was discussion surrounding the Mayor Kerley donation items. Ms. Renner suggested this be included in the items of acquisition discussion due to the large quantity of donations being reviewed.

Ms. Renner led a review of the Commission's collecting policy established by the group in 2010. Ms. Renner presented the following items offered to the Museum for acquisition:

- "Linda Kerley Center Opening" newspaper clipping (ca. 2016)
 Found in Linda Kerley Center closet and brought to the Museum by LKC staff for proper storage.
 Mayor Joyner suggested that the items could be loaned to the Lindy Kerley Center for display there. Multiple Commission members expressed interest in learning what other items related to municipal figures are in the Museum collection, a report on that info will be included in the September meeting agenda. Ms. Edmunds moved that the item be accepted. Mr. Moore

- Funeral Programs for Anne Morton and Carolyn Morton
- Birth Certificate copy for Anne Morton
- Marriage Certificate copy for Virgil Bryan and Anne Morton
- Death Certificate for Ford Morton

Donated by Jim Welman of Cordova. Museum Collections Coordinator performed extensive research and discovered that the aforementioned items belong to a Morton family in Memphis, of no relation to Collierville Morton families, and advised the donation be rejected.

Ms. Edmunds moved that the items be declined. Mr. Rutledge seconded. All were in favor, none opposed.

- Collierville Telephone Directory (1967)
- Jacket sewing pattern made from Collierville Herald Newspapers (1947)
- Art print of Collierville Town Square (undated, original photo ca. 1850)
 Donated by Pat Albee. Museum Collections Coordinator indicated that the museum collection already includes the 1967 telephone directory, and the jacket pattern in poor condition, thus advising rejecting these items. Collections Coordinator advocates that the art print be accepted.
 Ms. Edmunds made a motion to accept the art print only. Mr. Moore seconded. All were in favor, none opposed.
- Framed image of Stage Coach Rest Stop (original photo ca. 1850)
- Framed proclamation for Joseph Clayton Day (1996)
- Program for dedication of Joe Clayton Library at Collierville Middle School (2009)
- CHS Pathfinder Yearbooks (1948, 1950)
- Framed oil pastel image of Peterson Lake by Minnie Smith (1986)
 Donated by members of the Clayton Family. The donation included 30+ items, the above list are highlights, and Collections Coordinator advised that all items are found to be relevant to Collierville History. Ms. Renner made a motion to accept all of the items. Ms. Key seconded. All were in favor, none opposed.

New business on the September agenda will include a staff report on what Collierville municipal figures are currently documented in the museum collection.
